

Plan Your Visit

We can't wait to see you at the museum! If you haven't visited in a while we are delighted to welcome you back. You'll find the same rich experiences you love, but with a few changes. Here's the latest on what to expect:



TIMED ENTRY

All visitors—members and nonmembers—are asked to reserve a timed entry ticket in advance online at DurhamMuseum.org or over the phone.

Timed entry provides moderated attendance levels and paced guest arrivals so that you can begin social distancing at check-in! Members, sign into (or create) your online account to access your free tickets. Guests using special passes may call 402-444-5071 to reserve their entry time.



MASKS

The museum is currently operating within the Douglas County mask mandate. The Durham Museum is committed to the safety and health of our staff and visitors. Thus, we will continue to follow our current safety protocols until an announcement has been made otherwise.

For those who need a mask alternative, a limited number of face shields are available for check out.



SOCIAL DISTANCING

Reduced capacity has its perks! To help guests social distance the museum will continue to monitor capacity and ease into making more admission tickets available, as safety allows. 

Exhibit on Display! Now - January 30, 2022

Art and history combine in this unique exhibition experience that examines the lasting impact of the 19th Amendment. Using suffrageera (1848-1920) artwork from our partners at the Smithsonian and Library of Congress, *Beyond the Vote* explores conversations surrounding votes for women that took visual form in illustration, painting and propaganda. The Durham partnered with five local artists to create contemporary works inspired by vintage suffrage pieces. The artists help examine the legacy of votes for women and invite us to reflect on how the woman's vote impacts us today. Featured Artists Include: Nancy Friedemann-Sánchez, Sophie Newell, Ariel Panowicz, Celeste Butler and Renee' A. Ledesma.


Artist Panel: Beyond the Vote Virtual Event

Tuesday, August 10, 6:30-7:30PM CST

In celebration of *Beyond the Vote*, the museum will host a panel presentation featuring artists who contributed to the display. Using images of the past from the Smithsonian and Library of Congress, artists were inspired to create a modern representation of concepts surrounding women's suffrage. Each participating artist will speak about their process, inspiration and final artwork.

History is revealed to us in many ways. Artifacts, photographs and personal memories can help us make connections to our past. This fall, The Durham Museum presents Omaha Uncovered: Revealing History through Art and Story, an exhibit focused on uncovering the vast and fascinating history of our city. The exhibition highlights both preservation and conservation, giving visitors an up-close look into how history can come to life. Over the course of four months, conservators from the Gerald R. Ford Conversation Center will be "on exhibit" actively restoring a historic mural from 1905 entitled Aerial View of Omaha that once hung in the lobby of the Omaha Bee newspaper office. The beautifully painted mural, which is part of the museum's permanent collection, looks west from the Missouri River towards the western horizon and elegantly captures the layout of Omaha of the past and present. Lovers of maps, history and art will enjoy seeing the faded mural brought to new life over the duration of the project. Guests can also see preservation in action in our working lab of the Photo Archive. Museum staff will be in the exhibit actively digitizing historic photographs from the museum collection as well as highlighting stories of iconic Omaha photos through the personal memories of long-time Omaha resident and former museum employee/volunteer, Bill Gonzalez.

Join conservator Kenneth Bé in a preview of his work on *Aerial View of Omaha*. Bé will present information about the mural itself, its current condition and his plan for conserving the painting while on display in the coming months at the museum as a part of *Omaha Uncovered: Revealing History through Art and Story*.

Bé is originally from the Hudson Valley region north of New York City and has worked as a painting conservator at The Cleveland Museum of Art and more recently at Omaha's Ford Conservation Center since 2008.







Throughout the pandemic we adapted, offering free history-themed programs for families suddenly learning at home, plus virtual field trips when many students returned to school in the fall. The museum even launched a new program called Museum Live! which connected students and teachers with educators, curators and presenters from The Durham, the Smithsonian's American Museum of American History and other education partners.


