Cream of the Crop: Omaha Pioneers of the Food Scene October 7, 2023 - February 11, 2024

After publishing her book *From Julia Child's Kitchen*, Julia Child was described "as genuine and earthly as the plains of Nebraska" by reviewer Stephen Schmidt. Nebraska also had its own pioneers of the culinary world who worked to inspire other food fans with simple and enjoyable recipes.

North Omaha cateress Helen Mahammitt provided her services for high-profile events and began a cooking school to empower other Black women with skills and confidence as caterers. Just as Mahammitt worked diligently behind the scenes and teaching in the classroom, Martha Bohlsen did so through live television. Among the many programs first broadcast on television in Omaha, Bohlsen's focused on meals anyone could prepare at home.

Both women's passion for food and sharing their knowledge worked to mold Omaha's future chefs.

Summer Spotlight

What an incredible summer! We want to thank all of the members, visitors, supporters and friends who joined us for all the fun. From building with incredible imagination in the *Towers of Tomorrow with LEGO® Bricks* exhibition to a host of camps, tours, community events and more, The Durham Museum was proud to welcome more than 70,000 visitors to Union Station this summer alone! Thankfully, we had plenty of help from museum volunteers and docents who gave more than 3,000 hours of their time! On behalf of the entire museum team, we want to thank all of you who helped make the museum such a great space to foster community this summer.



Collection Highlight

Typically when people think about objects in a history museum's collection, they think of antiques—the obsolete, old things in the attic. However, we're constantly collecting from all of Omaha's past and present. A collection donated last year was filled with items from only a decade ago. Donated anonymously by the family of a former Omaha Nighthawks cheerleader, it preserves the history of Omaha's short-lived professional football team.

The Nighthawks joined the United Football League (UFL) as an expansion team in 2010. Omahans were clearly excited to watch the team—the Nighthawks' first four home games, at Rosenblatt Stadium, were 24,000-seat sellouts. The league even chose Rosenblatt for the 2010 championship game, the last event held at the historic stadium. The team then moved to TD Ameritrade Park (now Charles Schwab Field). Attendance dwindled along with the league's financial reserves, leading to an early end to the 2011 season and the league finally folding in 2012.
